RESULTS ACHIEVED ON THE IGCSE EXAMINATIONS IN MAY/JUNE 2014 SESSION

Second year (II/2) IGCSE students who took IGCSE subject examinations in May/June 2014 session achieved the following results:

72% grades range from A* to C:

- 24% \rightarrow grades A* & A
- 17% \rightarrow grade B
- 31% \rightarrow grade C
- 14% \rightarrow grade D
- 9% \rightarrow grade E
- 4% \rightarrow grade F
- 0,5% \rightarrow grade G

IGCSE ICE Certificates

Apart from IGCSE certificates, second year IGCSE students will get ICE Certificates (International Certificate of Education), as well, since they have passed minimum seven IGCSE subjects exams.

For the outstanding results achieved in May/June 2014 examination session (minimum five A or A* grades) students Aleksandar Radulovic and Dejan Kovac will get ICE Certificate with Distinction.

For excellent results achieved in May/June 2014 examination session (minimum five grades in the range A - C) ten students will get ICE Certificate with Merit. They are: David Gordić, Luka Dabović, Petra Divac, Ognjen Minić, Mila Nikolić, Matija Pavićević, Bojana Stojanov, Katarina Filipović, Itana Filipović and Aglaja Filipović.

Second year Students within the National Curriculum (II/1)

For the first time in the school year 2013/2014 the students attending the second year within the National Curriculum were given an opportunity to take IGCSE Foreign Languages examinations (German, Italian and French).

Seven students took and passed these exams achieving the grades in the range A* - C. They are: Damjan Spasojević, Sava Vuković, Dunja Nikolić, Jovana Topić, Dajana Devetaković, Igor Bućan, Andrej Ostojić, Andrija Mirković and Petar Radonjić.

The School Board commended all students for the results achieved hoping that they will continue developing enquiry and study skills, creativity and persistence. Teachers and other members of the school staff look forward to supporting them in their endeavour.

The final year students within IB Diploma Programme achieved outstanding results on IB DP examinations in May 2014 session. The average score is 33 and the average grade is 5.17. The student with the highest score this year is Nataša Novaković; she achieved 41 points. Five students achieved 35 or more points. They are: Milana Pejnović, Jovana Maksić, Belikse Ramljak, David Jelić and Joulien Bourgoignie.

The best results were achieved in the following subjects: English B - 6.05 (world average 5.70), Spanish B - 6.00, Mathematics SL 5. 44 (world average 4.48) German B - 6.00. Our students are continuing their education at the following universities: UCL, City University of Hong Kong, NYU Shanghai, City University London, Westminster London, University of Belgrade - Faculty of Law, Faculty of Economics, Finance & Administration etc.

CAMBRIDGE ENGLISH LANGUAGE ASSESSMENT

During 2013/2014 school year two groups of high school students attended preparatory classes for taking First Certificate and Cambridge Advanced examinations within Cambridge English Language Assessment.

In May/June 2014 examination sessions our students took and passed First Certificate in English examination. They are: Sara Zagrađanin, Katarina Komnenović, Maša Lopušina, Danica Gaković and Jovana Topić.

Being an approved Cambridge English Internal Centre, throughout the 2013/2014 school year, the school organised several pretesting sessions as well. These were Cambridge English and Cambridge Michigan pretesting sessions on different levels, both in primary and high school. The results achieved in these pretests together with the written feedback from the examiners are useful both to the teachers and the students because they give a comprehensive insight into the candidates' current language competence.
