
## ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

<u>Adverbs of frequency</u> indicate the frequency of actions. They tell
how many times things are done. The present simple tense is
usually used.



 Never, sometimes, often, frequently, seldom, always and usually are adverbs of frequency.

RULE: SUBJECT + ADVERB + VERB

E.g.: Mary usually gets up at 7 o 'clock.

**EXCEPTION: SUBJECT + VERB TO BE + N ADVERB** 

E.g.: I am never tired.

 Every weekend, once a month, twice a week, three times a year are also adverbs of frequency. They can be used at the beginning or at the end of the sentence.

E.g.: Every weekend we play tennis.
