

# ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

- Adverbs of frequency indicate the frequency of actions. They tell how many times things are done. The present simple tense is usually used.

- Never, sometimes, often, frequently, seldom, always and usually are **adverbs of frequency**.

**RULE: SUBJECT + ADVERB + VERB**

E.g.: Mary usually gets up at 7 o'clock.

**EXCEPTION: SUBJECT + VERB TO BE + N ADVERB**

E.g.: I am never tired.

- Every weekend, once a month, twice a week, three times a year are also **adverbs of frequency**. They can be used at the beginning or at the end of the sentence.

E.g.: Every weekend we play tennis.
