




A Birthday Surprise for Bird

“I will hurry and stir the paint,” says Duck.


“I will hurry and paint the bird home,” says Turtle.

“We did it, Turtle,” says Duck.


“Bird will like this purple bird home,”
says Turtle.






“Happy Birthday, Bird!” Turtle and Duck say. “Look at this gift we made for your birthday. Do you like your purple bird home?”



Kirk will find out that Sunburst likes to curl up in his lap and be petted. She will purr when Kirk strokes her fur.




Bertha, the Sales Clerk








Her boss is stern. "Bertha, you must go. Go to the sherbet shop and get a job there."


Bertha goes to the sherbet shop. Her job is serving sherbet, but Bertha is so slow that the sherbet melts as she serves it.

Pearl tells Sherm, “Earth Day is a special day. It is a day to help save the earth. You do not need a permit to help on Earth Day. Here is what we can do.”






Pearl goes on, “We can gather trash. We can learn how to put it in the right bins and bags. People will make new paper, glass, and cans from the trash we gather.”




Pearl tells Sherm, “We can plant gardens and trees. We can plant ferns and other plants. We can make shelters for animals and perches for birds.”




